HOSA PROFILE

Nationally HOSA = 201,152 members in 4,192 chapters in 48 states. HOSA also has a presence in Italy, Mexico, and Canada.

Utah HOSA = 3,629 members in 84 chapters

There are more than 2.1 million alumni members

20 percent of the HOSA national membership is male.

Non-Caucasians account for 49 percent of the HOSA national membership.

Utah HOSA has active secondary and post-secondary/collegiate chapters.

HOSA activities lead to over 300 career opportunities in healthcare.

DID YOU KNOW?

HOSA membership has increased an average of 9 percent every year for the last several years.

Five Utah HOSA student members have served as National HOSA state officers—two as HOSA National President.

Five Utah HOSA advisors have served on various National HOSA committees—two as Board Chairs.

HOSA members and advisors have the opportunity to apply for internships with the National Surgeon General and the United States Public Health Service.

In Utah, CTSOs align with the seven CTE Areas of Study/Programs of Study and more than 50 Career Pathways.

HOSA brings relevance to the classroom through industry-based competitive events, HOSA Leadership University, and community service.

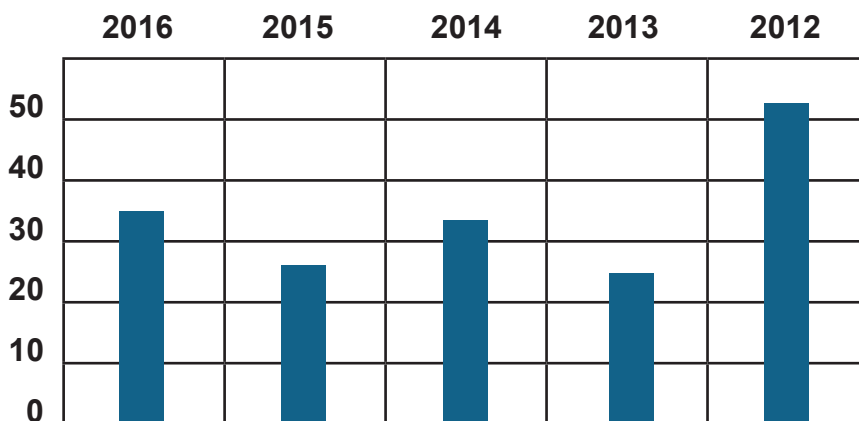
