Nationally HOSA = 217,902 members in 4,689 chapters in 48 states. HOSA also has a presence in Italy, Mexico, and Canada.

Utah HOSA = 4,041 members in 84 chapters

20 percent of the HOSA national membership is male.

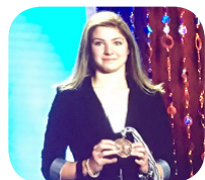
Non-Caucasians account for 49 percent of the HOSA national membership.

HOSA membership has increased an average of 9 percent every year for the last several years.

Five Utah HOSA advisors have served on various National HOSA committees—two as Board Chairs.

HOSA members and advisors have the opportunity to apply for internships with the National Surgeon General and the United States Public Health Service.

HOSA brings relevance to the classroom through industry-based competitive events, HOSA Leadership University, and community service.

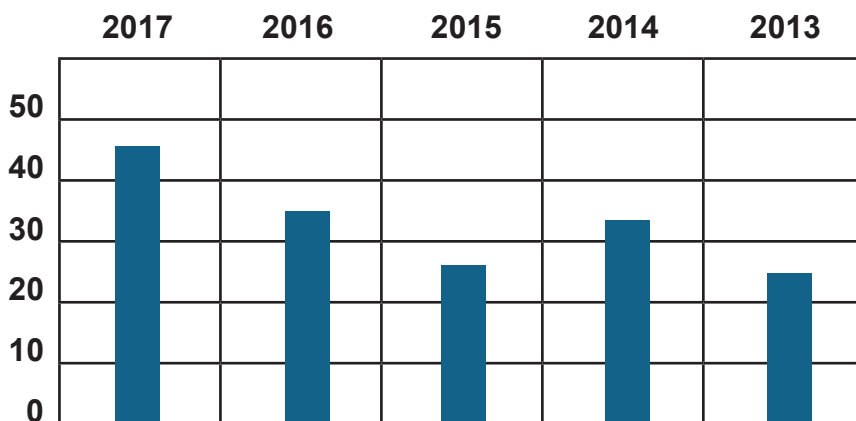
